Feasting with Famous Figures

A Thanksgiving Holiday Biography Project

For this year's feast, you're inviting three special guests who will travel through time to join you! In this Thanksgiving-themed biography project, you will research the lives of three historical figures, plan out the perfect Thanksgiving dinner, and reflect on what each of your famous guests would be thankful for this holiday season!

Project Overview

1. Dinner Invitations / Biographies

- a. Students will choose three famous historical figures to research for the assignment. You may choose from the list provided or find your own with teacher approval. Research each figure's life, beliefs, achievements, and experiences that shaped them into who they were.
- b. Complete the dinner for each of your famous dinner guests.

2. Thanksgiving Dinner

- a. You will plan out your Thanksgiving meal, considering what dish each of your guests would most likely bring with them.
- b. There must be conversation around your Thanksgiving table. Write out five topics that would likely be discussed amongst your guests and how each person would feel about it.

3. "What I'm Thankful For" Creative Writing

- a. Following dinner, all your guests must go around the table and tell what they are thankful for. You will write out a short paragraph from each guest's perspective, explaining what they have to be thankful for.
- b. Use your research and consider their background and life experience as you write these!

4. Presentation

- a. You will combine the steps above into a poster or presentation and present to the class.
- b. Be sure to include a picture of your guests!

• Device and Internet access for research, posterboard (or device for slide presentation), scissors, glue, pens, markers, etc.






